State Police arrest Randolph man on gun charges in Revere

A Randolph man was one of two people arrested by the State Police on firearm charges in Revere on Saturday evening.

State Police said Barkley Manuel, 28, was stopped by a state trooper on Bell Circle in Revere late Saturday for having an illegal dark tint on the windows of his car. When the trooper approached the car on foot, police said they saw an open alcoholic beverage inside.

Police said Manuel and the vehicle's passenger, Jamaine Burton, 29, of Boston, were both carrying knives that violated a Revere city ordinance, police said. During an inventory of the car, the trooper also found a loaded 9-millimeter Millennium G2 handgun, which neither of the men were licensed to carry, police said.

Police said Manuel also provided false identifying information about himself to the trooper and did not have an active license.

Both occupants were charged with possession of a firearm as a third offense, carrying a loaded firearm, possession of ammunition without license, being armed career criminals, possession of a high-capacity weapon and multiple ordinance violations related to the knives they are accused of carrying. Manuel was also charged with driving with a suspended license, failing to identify himself to police, driving with an open container of alcohol in the vehicle and violating a law on window tinting. Burton was cited for failure to wear a seatbelt.

They were arraigned in Chelsea District Court on Monday.
